Does Evil Exist?

A university professor challenged his students with this question. Did God create everything that exists?

The student became quiet before such an answer. The professor was quite pleased with himself and boasted to the students that he had proven once more that the Christian faith was a myth.

Another student raised his hand and said, "Can I ask you a question professor?"

"Of course", replied the professor.

The student stood up and asked, "Professor, does cold exist?"

"What kind of question is this? Of course it exists. Have you never been cold?" The students snickered at the young man's question.

The young man replied, "In fact sir, cold does not exist. According to the laws of physics, what we consider cold is in reality the absence of heat. Every body or object is susceptible to study when it has or transmits energy, and heat is what makes a body or matter have or transmit energy. Absolute zero (-460 degrees F) is the total absence of heat; all matter becomes inert and incapable of reaction at that temperature. Cold does not exist. Being filled with God is synonymous with our relationship with Him. We can see in Mark 1:35 that spending time in prayer was a characteristic of Jesus. Jesus went to His place of prayer "in the morning,...a great while before day," expressing its priority in His life. This description should drive us to examine our own commitment to communion with God the Father. The closer we are to God, Our Heavenly Father, the more we will be filled with His love and power to fulfill His will for our lives. Make it a point, daily, to set aside time to be alone with God and strengthen your relationship with Him.
